

## Checklist Execution of a Police Powers and Responsibilities Act Search Warrant, on a Solicitor's Premises.

Key actions to be carried out when police arrive at a solicitor's office:

Key Action	Notes
Check the warrant is issued under the <i>Police</i> <i>Powers and Responsibilities Act 2000</i> .	If the warrant has been issued by another authority check powers under the relevant legislation.
Check the solicitor's premises is the place to be searched.	Remember the police can also apply for post-search approval in particular circumstances.
Check whether the offence under investigation has been identified.	
Check the powers and conditions in the warrant.	
Check whether there is a need to provide documents or access information.	
Check details of the warrant evidence that is being sought.	
Do not obstruct the police.	
Seek legal advice and/or consult with affected clients.

Follow the procedures in the Search Warrant Guidelines.	
Check police officer is aware of the <b>Guidelines</b> and the protocols that must be followed.	
Make a claim of privilege in writing following the guidelines unless a waiver has been received from affected clients.
