A notice under s57 of the *Legal Profession Act 2007* must be in accordance with this approved form and given to Queensland Law Society within seven days after the conviction of an offence or seven days after the date on which the person is charged with a serious offence.

Section 57 does not apply to a 'show cause' event to which chapter 2 part 2.4 division 7 of the *Legal Profession Act 2007* applies.

As to the offences which are required to be disclosed, see the *Supreme Court (Admission) Rules 2004*.

The expression, 'serious offence', is defined in Schedule 2 of the *Legal Profession Act 2007*.
