Draft decision on fee free ATMs in remote Indigenous communities

Thank you for the opportunity to provide a response on the Draft decision on fee free ATMs in remote Indigenous communities

The Queensland Law Society (the Society) is the peak professional body for the State's legal practitioners. We represent and promote nearly 12,000 legal professionals, increase community understanding of the law, help protect the rights of individuals and advise the community about the many benefits solicitors can provide. The Society strongly supports the ACCC granting re-authorisation to parties to provide fee free ATM services in remote Indigenous communities for 10 years.
