Conditions of entry

Entrants must:

- Identify as a First Nations person
- Be a university (undergraduate or postgraduate) student (can be part time or full time) who is currently enrolled or who has graduated or will graduate between 1 July 2019 and 30 June 2020

Task:

- Entrants are invited to submit:
 - Artwork to be used for Lawlink; and
 - Include a story behind the artwork

About Lawlink

The Lawlink Programme was established by QLS in 2003 and aims to bridge the cultural divide between First Nations law students and the legal profession.

First Nations students gain insight into the legal profession through formal and informal meetings and site visits to law firms, barristers' chambers, community legal centres and various courts. While at the same time, members of the legal profession have the benefit of experiencing student led discussions and presentations at participating law firms.

QLS is committed to supporting and increasing representation of First Nations people working and practising in the legal profession and has seen the success of many First Nations solicitors and lawyers who have been involved in the Lawlink Programme.

There is no entry fee to enter this competition.

Information on how to enter and prize details form part of these terms and conditions.

By submitting your artwork you will be entering this competition and will be subject to these terms and conditions.

Deadline to submit artwork and story – 5:00pm AEST on Friday 12 June 2020.

The Artwork will be used to support and promote QLS Lawlink in accordance with the terms below.

- All entrants agree that:
 - They are eligible to apply;
 - The artwork and story is their own work;
 - In submitting the artwork and story, if their artwork is selected as the winner or runner up, the winner entrant and runner up entrant agree to licence the artwork and story to the Promoter under a Creative Commons Attribution Share-Alike 3.0 licence available <https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-sa/3.0/au/>:
 - Attribution: The Promoter must always provide credit to the entrant as the original owner of the artwork and story;
 - Share-Alike: If the Promoter remixes, transforms, or builds upon the artwork, the Promoter must distribute the derivative/s under the same licence as the original;
 - The use of the licence is to allow the Promoter's Design Team to use the whole artwork or alternatively focus on segments or portions of the artwork in promoting Lawlink;
 - All other entrants agree that in submitting the artwork and story they agree to licence the artwork and story to the Promoter a Creative Commons Attribution No Derivatives 3.0 licence available <https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-nd/3.0/au/>:
 - Attribution: The Promoter must always provide credit to the entrant as the original owner of the artwork;
 - No derivatives: If the Promoter remixes, transform, or builds upon the material, the Promoter may not distribute the modified material.
 - Artwork submitted can be displayed as a digital print or physical print at Queensland Law Society House, or at other premises at the direction of the Promoter, to showcase all entrants between the dates 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2024;
 - The winner's artwork will be used to promote LawLink between 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2022 and the runner-up's artwork will be used to promote LawLink between 1 July 2022 and 30 June 2024;
 - Artwork that is submitted digitally will not be returned to entrants; and
 - From the date of announcing the winner and runner-up, the Promoter will contact entrants who submitted artwork via non-digital means to organise the return of the physical artwork.

Entry period

Entry into the prize draw opens at **9:00am AEST on Monday 18 May 2020** and closes at **5:00pm AEST on Friday 12 June 2020**

Entry method

Entrants must submit an artwork and story to Queensland Law Society:

- A high resolution photo of the artwork

- Confirmation that you are eligible to apply and that the artwork and story is your own work
- Confirmation of which First Nations Charity and their website and contact details you wish to nominate if you are successful
- Entrant's email and telephone contact details

 - Confirmation that you are eligible to apply and that the artwork and story is your own work
 - Confirmation of which First Nations Charity and their website and contact details you wish to nominate if you are successful
 - Entrant's email and telephone contact details

It is the responsibility of the entrant to ensure that he/she completes the artwork and provides a correct telephone number to be contacted in order to claim the prize.

Maximum number of entries

An entrant may enter the prize draw as many times as they wish during the entry period.

Draw judging details

The panel will determine the winner and runner-up and will announce the result at:

- 4:00pm AEST on Friday 26 June 2020 at Law Society House, Queensland Law Society.

Panel –

- Panel is to be comprised of:
 - QLS President
 - 1 representative from QLS
 - 1 representative from RAPWG
 - 1 representative from the Equity and Diversity Committee
- At least 2 or more panel representatives must identify as a First Nations person
- In assessing the artwork and story, the Panel is not provided the details of the entrant

Prize details

There are two (2) prizes:

- Winner:
 - Receives \$500
 - Nominates a First Nations charity for QLS to donate \$500
 - Has their artwork utilised for QLS Lawlink and Lawlink related purposes from 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2022
 - Has their artwork and story featured in Proctor, QLS communications and Events
- Runner up:
 - Receives \$500
 - Nominates a First Nations charity for QLS to donate \$500
 - Has their artwork utilised for QLS Lawlink and Lawlink related purposes from 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2024
 - Has their artwork and story featured in Proctor, QLS communications and Events

The Promoter at its absolute discretion may extend the entry period and drawing date of this competition.

The Promoter's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into in this regard.

Total prize pool

Prizes valued \$2000 including GST.

Notification of winners

The winner and runner-up will be contacted via email and/or telephone within seven (7) days of the decision being announced.

Publication details

The winner's details and the runner-up's details will be published in QLS media channels including QLS Update, Proctor and QLS social media.

Prize claim and date

The winner must, in order to collect the prize:

1. acknowledge receipt of the Promoter's winning notification email within seven (7) days; and
2. if the artwork was submitted electronically, make arrangements with the Promoter to organise delivery of the artwork to the Promoter; and
3. provide EFT details and provide sufficient details for the delivery of the prize to the First Nations Charity.

A failure to provide adequate details for delivery within seven (7) days of being contacted will lead to forfeiture of the prize and the panel will decide an alternate winner or runner-up not less than fourteen (14) days after the original announcement of the winner or runner-up.

Unclaimed prize draw date

If the prize is not claimed within seven (7) days of notification, an unclaimed prize decision will be conducted at the discretion of the Promoter within fourteen (14) days of the original decision.

The Promoter will make every reasonable effort to locate the prize winner of the unclaimed prize decision and to deliver the prize to the unclaimed prize winner.

Release and Indemnity

The Promoter shall not be liable for any cost, loss or expense arising out of the acceptance of the prize or participation in the competition including any damage or injury suffered or sustained including personal injury, loss of opportunity or profit or damage to property whether direct or indirect or consequential or due to the deliberate or negligent acts or omissions of the Promoter or otherwise.

Cancellation of Prize Draw

The Promoter may cancel, suspend or modify the competition for any reason including computer virus, bugs, tampering, unauthorised intervention, fraud, technical failure or any other cause beyond the Promoter's control which may affect the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the competition.

The Promoter may also cancel, suspend or modify the competition if the determination of the prize winner or the delivery of the prize is prevented or hindered by any outside agent or event including but not limited to vandalism, power failure, tempest, natural disaster, acts of God, civil unrest, COVID-19 or other declared pandemics or strikes or other industrial action.

Personal Information

The Promoter is collecting your information under the *Information Privacy Act 2009*. By entering the competition your personal information will be used for the purpose of the competition and for LawLink related purposes and to publish details of the prize winner in its communications and publications.
